The *Verified Petitions for Recognition of Foreign Proceeding and Related Relief* (collectively, the “**Chapter 15 Petitions**”) was brought by BDO Canada Limited, the court-appointed receiver (the “**Receiver**”) and authorized foreign representative of Combat Sports Inc. (“**Combat CND**”) and Combat Sports, Inc. (“**Combat USA**,” and together with Combat CND, “**Combat**”) in a proceeding (the “**Canadian Proceeding**”) under Subsection 243(1) of Canada’s *Bankruptcy and Insolvency Act*, R.S.C. 1985, c. B-3 (as amended) and Section 101 of Canada’s

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1 *Courts of Justice Act*, R.S.O. 1990, c. C.43 (as amended), pending before the Superior Court of  
2 Justice of Ontario (the “**Canadian Court**”).

3 By the Chapter 15 Petitions, the Receiver requested that the Court enter an order  
4 recognizing the Canadian Proceeding as a foreign main proceeding and giving full force and  
5 effect to the Order Made After Application of the Canadian Court dated February 25, 2013 (the  
6 “**Initial Order**”).

7  
8 Pursuant to the *Order Specifying Form and Manner of Service of Notice and Setting*  
9 *Hearing on Relief Requested in Chapter 15 Petitions* entered on February 26, 2013, on February  
10 28, 2013, the Receiver duly served A *Notice of (A) Filing and Hearing on Petitions Seeking*  
11 *Recognition of Foreign Proceedings pursuant to Chapter 15 of the United States Bankruptcy*  
12 *Code, (B) Entry of Temporary Restraining Order Granting Provisional Relief in Aid of Canadian*  
13 *Proceedings and (C) Hearing on Motion for Preliminary Injunction* (the “**Notice**”) via first class  
14 mail on the United States Trustee for the Western District of Washington and all known creditors  
15 of Combat [Docket 21].  
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17 The Notice informed all parties that the deadline to file and serve responses or objections  
18 to the Chapter 15 Petitions was March 15, 2013 at 5:00 p.m., and that if no responses or  
19 objections were timely filed and served the Court may grant the relief requested in the Chapter 15  
20 Petitions without further hearing.

21 No responses or objections to the Chapter 15 Petitions have been filed and served.

22 The Court has considered and reviewed the Chapter 15 Petitions and the Affidavit of Ken  
23 Pearl in support thereof and, based on the foregoing, and upon further consideration of the record,  
24 and as sufficient and proper notice of the Chapter 15 Petitions and the relief requested therein  
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1 have been provided, and it appearing that the relief requested in the Chapter 15 Petitions is in the  
2 best interest of Combat and other parties in interest, after due deliberation and sufficient cause  
3 appearing therefore:

4 **NOW THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED:**

5 1. The Chapter 15 Petitions are GRANTED.

6 2. The Initial Order, including any extensions or amendments thereto, is hereby given  
7 full force and effect in the United States.

8 3. Upon entry of this Order, the Temporary Restraining Order entered on February  
9 26, 2013 [Docket 11] is hereby vacated as the protections provided therein are negated by the  
10 granting of the Chapter 15 Petitions.

11 4. Upon entry of this Order, the Receiver's *Ex Parte Motion for Preliminary*  
12 *Injunction* filed on February 26, 2013 [Docket 3] is hereby deemed withdrawn and the hearing  
13 scheduled for March 22, 2013 at 11:00 a.m. is cancelled as the relief requested therein is negated  
14 by the granting of the Chapter 15 Petitions.

15 5. This Court shall retain jurisdiction with respect to all matters relating to the  
16 interpretation or implementation of this Order.
