(Interim Distribution and Claims Process Order)

Remedy claimed or sought:

- An Order in substantially the form of proposed draft Order (Interim Distribution) filed herewith authorizing and directing BDCO Canada Limited, court-appointed receiver of the property, assets and undertakings of P.S. Electric Ltd. (the "Receiver"), to make the following interim distributions from the receivership estate:
 - to Canada Revenue Agency, the sum of \$19,263.70 (comprising \$15,928.57 in respect of GST and \$3,335.13 in respect of unremitted source deductions);
 - (b) to Service Canada, the sum of \$16,178.74;

- (c) to the Saskatchewan Ministry of Finance, the sum of \$23,486.99;
- (d) to Royal Bank of Canada, the sum of \$379,557.02 (plus any interest and/or costs accruing from and after April 6, 2021); and
- (e) to Business Development Bank of Canada, the sum of \$516,300.80 (plus any interest and/or costs accruing from and after March 31, 2021).
- 2. An Order approving the activities, fees, and disbursements of the Receiver and the fees and disbursements of legal counsel to the Receiver.
- 3. A Claims Process Order setting out a process by which the Receiver may receive, assess, and adjudicate the claims of the remaining creditors of P.S. Electric Ltd. (the "**Debtor**").
- 4. Such further and other relief as counsel may request and this Honourable Court may allow.

Grounds for making this application:

Order for Interim Distribution

- 5. The Debtor carried on business as an electrical contractor in and around Estevan, Saskatchewan, prior to the appointment of the Receiver on October 13, 2020.
- In January and early February of 2021, the Receiver caused all or substantially all of the Debtor's equipment and inventory to be sold at auction through McDougall Auctioneers Ltd., yielding net sale proceeds in the amount of \$694,072.
- 7. Since the appointment of the Receiver in October of 2020, the Receiver has successfully collected accounts receivable owing to the Debtor in the amount of \$344,567. As well, upon assuming control of the Debtor's bank accounts, the Receiver came into possession of cash in the amount of \$120,032.
- 8. The amounts collected by the Receiver to date are more than sufficient to:
 - (a) pay all amounts owed by the Debtor to Canada Revenue Agency and to other creditors on a super-priority basis;
 - (b) satisfy the indebtedness owed by the Debtor to its senior secured creditor, Royal Bank of Canada ("**RBC**"); and
 - (c) satisfy the indebtedness owed by the Debtor to its second secured creditor, Business
 Development Bank of Canada ("BDC").

- 9. The Receiver has received opinions from its independent legal counsel confirming that, subject to customary assumptions and qualifications, the security interests in the Debtor's property held by RBC and BDC, respectively, are valid and enforceable.
- 10. As more particularly detailed in the Second Report of the Receiver dated April 27, 2021, the actions of the Receiver have at all times been conducted with efficiency and integrity, with due regard for the interests of all parties, and with the support of RBC and BDC, the senior secured creditors.

Claims Process Order

- 11. After the interim distribution contemplated above is made (and as a result of the Receiver's ongoing efforts to collect additional accounts receivable) there are expected to be funds in the Receivership estate to fund a distribution to the Debtor's unsecured creditors.
- 12. In order to ensure that the remaining funds are distributed *pro rata* in accordance with the remaining unsecured claims, the Receiver respectfully requests that this Honourable Court grant a Claims Process Order in order that the claims of the unsecured creditors may be solicited, proven and adjudicated in an orderly fashion.
